The month of November begins and ends with celebrations of thanksgiving. On November 1, we give thanks for all the saints who have gone before us, both those known and those unknown. For many, November 2 is a time to give thanks and remembrance for family and friends who have died in the Lord on All Souls' Day, or All the Faithful Departed.

In these two days, we reflect on people who have been role models for us, those who have inspired our walk with God. For me, as well as many others, these role models begin with our parents. My father was a major influence in my life, both in family life and, now, as a priest. In addition to close family members, there are many others who have guided our lives, even when they were unaware of the impact they may have had on us. As we spend time this month remembering those who have been the guiding lights of our families, church, and nation, let us remember those who do not have these opportunities to share with friends and loved ones. Let us carve out a little time to give thanks for those who have made our lives special, especially those who never knew the impact they had on us. And then, as this month comes to an end and we turn our focus to a new year in the church calendar and the countdown to Christmas, let us give thanks to the One who truly made all of this possible - Jesus Christ.

Reports from the Bishop's Committee for August.

Bishop's Committee August 4, 2024 Minutes

Present: Fr. Chandler Jackson, Rob Barns, Debbie Smith.

Fr. Jackson opened the meeting at 11:22 am with prayer and a devotion on the Collect for Proper 13.

Discussion - At a previous meeting, George asked: What would we do if we had \$50,000 in the bank? We came up with the following ideas:

- Purchase a van to provide rides for people who cannot get out to our location
- Have a table or food trailer on the square or in the park when there are events
- Participate in the Ozark Community Fair at the OC and at the similar event in Nixa to advertise our services and our ministries
- Look at the youth program in Lebanon to see if there is something there we could mirror
- Laundry Day provide detergent and quarters for people at the laundromat once a month

Having had a month to think about these ideas, are there other ideas we might want to pursue? What might be our next steps?

Most of the discussion focused on Laundry Day. We could do this at the laundromat on the third or fourth Saturday of each month, providing laundry detergent, fabric softener, and quarters for the machines. We can write a grant to the Diocesan Central Granting Committee for funding. We would need a few volunteers each month to greet people and hand out supplies. Advertising - flyers could be placed at Least of These and Family

Services, as well as at the laundromat. Lisa offered to check with the laundromat to see if they were ok with us doing this.

Other discussion was on participating in the Ozark Community Expo on Sept. 7, 9am-3pm. We have flyers to hand out. Cookies could be offered. We need to check on cost to participate. We will have a brief meeting after service next week (Aug. 11), to make any decisions on this.

Rob suggested another idea - asking the school district if they had any projects a small group of volunteers could do. He will check with them.

Reports:

Secretary - June minutes - Debbie moved and Rob seconded motion to approve minutes. Motion passed.

Treasurer - Debbie moved Rob seconded approval of the treasurer's report. Motion passed.

Warden - "In awe that we, St. Matt's, keep going." He is eternally grateful to all.

Priest - On the road this week to Kansas City for various meetings and activities. I'll be back Wednesday evening. Deanery Council was held yesterday at Grace, Carthage where 15 of the 18 churches were represented. The Bishop Search Committee has completed their work and announced the slate of four candidates. Please read their biographies and other information on the diocesan website and plan to attend the Meet and Greet at Christ Church Springfield at 6:00 on September 17. Give your feedback and impressions to Lisa and/or Chandler as they are our voting delegates at convention.

Diocesan Convention will be November 8 and 9 with the business meeting on Friday and the voting for our next bishop on Saturday. Clergy and lay vote separately and the election requires a majority from both groups on the same ballot.

Old Business:

a. Audit - Ron Weil, the diocesan finance administrator met with us. He was very pleased that we had followed his suggestions from last year and had only one suggestion this year - that the Bishop's Committee pass a "Common Transactions" document authorizing the treasurer to pay OPC and Gary each month, even though we don't receive invoices from them.

New Business: None.

Calendar -

Least of These Food Bags collection will be begin on September 8 and wrap up on October 6. They will bring us the bags ahead of time so we can collect food and money to support them. They will come after Oct. 6 to pick everything up.

Our next meeting will be September 8 at approximately 11:15, after the potluck dinner. This is a week later than normal because of the Labor Day holiday. It will not be hybrid.

Meeting adjourned at 12:04 with prayer.
