## Ready or not, Christmas is coming!

Where better to get ready than around the family Advent wreath. Here, for four Sundays and Christmas Day, we will refresh again what it means to be so loved that we are going to receive the gift of God's Son.

#### Advent means to come.

- To come together as a family for prayer, song, story, sharing or action.

# Reports from the Bishop's Committee for September.

Bishop's Committee September 8, 2024 Minutes

Present: Fr. Chandler Jackson, Rob Barns, George Keller, Debbie Smith.

Fr. Jackson opened the meeting at 11:17 am with prayer and a devotion on St. Matthew as his feast day is in a couple of weeks. Matthew was a tax collector, a Jew, who worked for the Romans. Jesus called him and he left everything behind! May we use him as an example for us in setting our priorities.

Discussion - Follow-up on our discussion last month.

- Ozark Community Fair it will cost us \$150 to join the Chamber of Commerce. To do it this year, we would have had to pay for a larger booth and we decided to wait until next year. If we join the Chamber after the first of the year, it will cost us the same amount (\$150) and we will be able to get a smaller, non-profit organization booth.
- Laundry Day It costs \$3/load for each washer and dryer load. We can get cards for the machines which would mean we wouldn't need to have a lot of cash on hand when we are there. 10 loads in each type of machine (washer and dryer) per hour for 4 hours would cost \$240 each time we were there. To finance this, we could apply for a diocesan grant of \$1500 and contribute \$500 from the Dinner Fund. This would give us 6 months or more for a trial run. Fr. Chandler will talk with Steven Bruce about logistics and marketing ideas as Mr. Bruce has done this and advised other churches. Lisa and Rob will contact the owner of the laundromat about possible days/times to do this and explore cost of the cards.

### Reports:

Secretary - August minutes - Rob moved and George seconded motion to approve minutes. Motion passed.

Treasurer - Debbie moved and George seconded approval of the treasurer's report. Rob pointed out that the Discretionary Fund is low. The loose offering on the fifth Sunday of the month goes to replenish this fund. The money in Marion Medical Mission was a donation from the Praters which has already been sent on. Motion passed.

Warden - We need a treasurer! Priest -

• The candidates for bishop will be touring the diocese the week of September 16. They will be in Carthage on the 16<sup>th</sup> and then come to St. Matt's first thing Tuesday morning. This is a time we can answer their questions about our sharing the building with the Presbyterians and our outreach ministries. Pastor Becky will be with us. After they leave us, they will go to the Council of Churches of the Ozarks for a tour of that facility, then on to St. James' to meet with the clergy. At 5:00 they will meet with youth and at 6:00 with everyone. On Wednesday, they head up to Lee's Summit and then to Kansas City. We will find out how they hold up under such a schedule.

- Consecration of the new bishop will be May 3, 2025. There will be limited seating at the cathedral so the committee is recommending people hold watch parties at area churches. The Consecration Committee is planning to have a reception in Springfield shortly after the consecration so people can have a chance to meet the new bishop.
- Archives I requested a new flat file cabinet in my request for 2025. The Diocesan Council approved purchasing it out of this year's budget (\$7300). This will allow me to house blueprints and other large documents properly. When this comes in, the crew that moves it down to the archives will move a fireproof cabinet down from the second floor to house sensitive files.

Old Business: Phone - George has gotten the church a new phone. The contract gives us 7860 minutes, 10,000 texts, and 5.5 gigabytes of data through Sept. 15, 2025.

New Business: Facebook is becoming more problematic for livestreaming services. Another option would be to move to YouTube. Many other churches have already made this move and find it works well. Ruth commented that they have watched services from other churches on YouTube and it is nice. Fr. Chandler will look into making the switch.

October 27 - the bishop will be with us for her annual visitation. We will have a potluck after the service.

Our next meeting will be October 6 at approximately 11:15, after the potluck dinner. Since Rob and Lisa will be out of town, we may cancel the meeting if there is no pressing business. We will still have the potluck.

There will not be a potluck on November 3 as we will have just had the one for the bishop the week before.

Meeting adjourned at 12:35 with prayer.
