Pastoral Ponderings

On September 21 each year, the church celebrates the Feast of St. Matthew. This year, that day falls on the third Sunday of the month. But, who was St. Matthew? We should be interested in knowing this since our congregation is named for him.

The short answer to the question of who is St. Matthew is - who knows? He seems to be a mystery in church history. The first Gospel is named for him, but scholars generally believe that the man named in the gospel as Matthew was probably long dead before the book bearing his name was written. In the ninth chapter of this Gospel, we read that Matthew was "sitting at the tax booth" when Jesus called him. At the beginning of the next chapter, Matthew is listed among the twelve disciples, again as a tax collector. However, in both Mark and Luke, Matthew is not named at all, but rather a man named Levi is listed as a tax collector. Same person? We don't know.

There is a tradition that this man, Matthew, did collect a group of sayings and stories about Jesus that may have been used in the writing of this gospel, but there are no copies of such a document still in existence. Many scholars subscribe to this belief, in spite of the lack of its existence because early Christian writers mention seeing such a document.

There are also several traditions about what became of this man after the Resurrection as he never is mentioned again in scripture. The most widely accepted is that he went to India to evangelize there, but there is no evidence to back this up. We also have no idea of the circumstances of his death. Some stories say Matthew died peacefully, while others list various forms of horrific torture. As with everything else about Matthew, we will never know.

So, why do we honor this man Matthew? I believe the most compelling reason to accept the idea that such a man really existed and was an early disciple of Jesus is the fact that no good Jew (or Christian) would have associated with such a person. Tax collectors were shunned like a dreaded disease. The fact that his name appears anywhere near the gospels is evidence that he must have been real. There is no other reason to include him at all.

As we gather on the third Sunday to commemorate St. Matthew, let us remember the deeply flawed man who Jesus called to travel with Him. Let us remember the tax collector who gave up everything he had to follow Jesus. Let us look for ways in our own lives to drop everything and follow Jesus.
