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Pastoral Ponderings

In place of my usual Pastoral Ponderings, I would like to offer this reflection on our Stewardship Campaign this year.

Dear People of St. Matt's,

As Christians we are story tellers. We have an ancient narrative, one that describes the beginning of time and the relationship between God and God's Creation. We see this story grow through the prophetic tradition until our story recounts the life and gifts of the Son of God. But the story doesn't end with the Resurrection just as it did not end with the Cross, it continues on in each of us today as we encounter and are transformed by the Good News.

Luke's Gospel is bookended by the animated story-telling of two women named Mary. Early in the Gospel, Mary the mother of Jesus, tells us of her encounter with the Divine who informs her that she will bear a child who will change the world. She proclaims her joy: "Tell out my soul! The Greatness of the Lord!" At the end of the Gospel, another Mary, Mary Magdalene, visits the tomb to discover it empty and receives instructions from the Risen Christ to go tell the others. She carries this Good News with jubilance to the Disciples.

What is your Good News; the idea, dream, challenge placed in your heart by God, that needs to be shared? What is the ministry to which you are called which will change the world, sharing your talents, gifts, and love with your neighbors?

Our Stewardship Campaign this year focuses on these stories – the ones inside you, the ones you are still writing, the ones we tell about those who have gone before us. We are all a part of this ongoing narrative – the ongoing Creation. As you pray about how you will share your gifts with us this year, think about how God is calling you to tell out your soul, to spread the Good News far and wide. Hear the stories that we share weekly throughout the campaign that relate the creative spark in us with the ways in which we are called to serve God and love our neighbor.

Tell out my soul! The Greatness of the Lord!

From the Computer of the Bishop's Warden

For those of you who read the Forward Day by Day each day or at least once in a while, you will notice that on some days there is a name or names at the very top of the page. As I looked ahead to October 1st I found two names that were totally unfamiliar to me. Those names were Remigius of Rheims and Therese of Lisieux. Please do not ask me to pronounce either of them. But, I thought it would be interesting to find out something about these two who were important in the life of the church.

Saint Remigius (437-13 January 533) was the Bishop of Rheims and "Apostle of the Franks". He studied at Rheims and soon became so noted for his learning and sanctity, and his high status, that he was elected Bishop of Rheims at 21 years old. At this point he was still a layman. On December 25th 496, he baptized Clovis I, King of the Franks. This baptism led to about 3000 additional converts and was important in the Christianization of the Franks. Because of the efforts of Clovis I, a large number of churches were established in the formerly pagan lands of the Frankish empire. He never attended any of the church councils but, in 517 Remigius held a synod at Rheims, at which after a heated discussion, he converted a bishop of Arian views. The tomb of St. Remigius was deliberately desecrated on October 7, 1793 by a Commissioner of the Convention during the French Revolution due to the link between the tomb and royal patronage. His feast day in France and in the Traditional Catholic Church in the United Kingdom and the USA is celebrated on October 1st. Remigius is also honored in the Church of England and in the Episcopal Church on October 1st.

Therese of Lisieux (2 January 1873 – 30 September 1897) was a French Discalced Carmelite, who is widely venerated in modern times. In English she is known as the *Little Flower of Jesus*, or more simply, the *Little Flower*. She is one of the most popular saints in the history of the church, although she was obscure in her lifetime. Pope Pius X called her "the greatest saint of modern times". At an early age, she felt a call to religious life and, after overcoming various obstacles, in 1888, at the age of 15, she became a nun, joining two of her elder sisters in the Carmelite community of Lisieux in Normandy. After nine years as a nun, in her last 18 months at Carmel, she fell into a night of faith, in which she felt Jesus was absent. She was tormented by doubts that God existed. Therese died at the age of 24 from tuberculosis. Pope John Paul II declared her a Doctor of the Church. Her feast day in the General Roman Calendar was October 3rd from 1927 until it was moved to October 1st in 1969. She is well known throughout the world, with the Basilica of Lisieux being the second most popular place of pilgrimage in France after Lourdes.

So, why did I go on this mini history lesson about two ordinary people who became important? I did it to show that we, ordinary people, can have an influence in what goes on day

after day. I do not expect any of us to be listed on the top right corner of the pages of Forward Day by Day, but who knows!

Reports from the Bishop's Committee for August

Bishop's Committee August 3, 2025 Minutes

Present: Fr. Chandler Jackson, Rob Barns, George Keller, Jennifer Marbut, Debbie Smith.

Fr. Jackson opened the meeting at 10:51am with a prayer for church meetings and a reading from Matthew Kelly's "Holy Moments. In the reading, "The Rest of Your Life", Kelly says that life is short and we all waste some of it. Using the story of the Transfiguration, Kelly says each Holy

Moment gives us a glimpse of what is possible. The rest of our lives is waiting for us. That life will be filled with moments. Will they be holy or unholy? The choice is ours.

Reports

Secretary - Rob moved and George seconded that the minutes of the July 13 meeting be approved. Motion passed. Debbie asked about the question to the Bishop regarding the Common Cup. Fr. Chandler replied the Bishop has heard from several congregations about this and is asking for input. She plans to provide a directive this Fall. Fr. Chandler stated that he provided input on why we prefer to retain the individual cups, as well as the Common Cup.

Treasurer - The July financial report was presented. George moved and Debbie seconded that the financial report be accepted. Motion passed.

Warden - There is grant money available from the diocese for outreach activities. One possibility would be to ask for funding for an ad in the Christian County newspaper, giving service times, etc. We already have a listing in the free section of calendar events for the dinners. This would have more information about the church. George suggested the Rob explore the cost of such an ad for one year and, if it does not exceed \$1000, for Rob to go ahead and write the grant. Rob agreed to do that. It was decided that an ad in the Springfield papers would not be beneficial. Rob also pointed out that the Chamber of Commerce is planning a "Welcome Packet" for realtors to give out to new home buyers. We have already given them some of our tri-fold brochures to use in that packet.

Priest - Diocesan Council meets Saturday. There will probably be some discussion regarding the Common Cup. He will be going up to work in the diocesan archives this Friday. There will be a clergy conference in Branson in October, but not much information has been shared yet.

Old Business: The annual audit will be August 21.

New Business: None.
