### Pastoral Ponderings

As we begin a new liturgical year, we are also completing a calendar year, 2025. Some are looking ahead to tax season and how you might maximize your deductions, while decreasing your tax liability. The church can help.

On the table outside the main sanctuary doors, are two new brochures from the Episcopal Church Foundation. One is entitled, *Stewards of God's bounty*. It covers planned giving – that process where we look at our estate to see how our legacy might impact organizations we support. In addition to our wills, there are a variety of Life Income Gifts we can explore, including a Pooled Income Fund, a Charitable Remainder Trust, a Charitable Gift Annuity, and a Charitable Lead Trust. All of these are explained in the brochure.

The other is entitled, When there's a will, there's a way. This brochure gives suggestions of ideas to consider before you head to your legal advisor's office. Some of the ideas include specific asset bequests, trusts within a will, and contingent beneficiaries.

Additional resources are available that we can acquire for you. They are listed on the back of both brochures. If you are interested in any of these additional topics, let me know and we will get copies of the brochures and booklets listed.

One of the projects we have undertaken as a congregation is memorial service planning. Rob has been a bulldog in getting each of us (me included) to fill out the planning guide so we have a copy on file. I can tell you this has been very beneficial for a couple of families already. By filling out the guide, you are telling us what YOU want for your memorial service. As with pre-planning your funeral desires at the funeral home, this is an additional step you can take to relieve your loved

ones of trying to decide what the service will look like. Thank you to all who have completed these guides. There are additional copies on the same table in case you want to update your planning guide.

By the time this is read, we will have already celebrated the first Sunday in Advent. So, I thought it might be a good idea to simply include six ideas about the Advent season. As we are all

busy during this season, I do not want to make this a long drawn out reflection about the Advent season.

- 1. Advent marks the beginning of the Christian liturgical year, typically starting four Sundays before Christmas. This year, 2025, Advent begins on November 30<sup>th</sup>.
- 2. It is a time of preparation and anticipation for the celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ. With all the "business" we bring upon ourselves, let us not forget the why and the whom we are celebrating.
  - 3 The word "Advent" comes from the Latin "adventus," meaning "coming" or "arrival."

#### Reports from the Bishop's Committee for October

Bishop's Committee October 5, 2025 Minutes

Present: Fr. Chandler Jackson, Rob Barns, George Keller, Jennifer Marbut, Betty Gloyd.

Fr. Jackson opened the meeting at 10:58am with a prayer and a devotion on St. Francis, whose feast day was yesterday.

#### Reports

Secretary - Rob moved and George seconded that the minutes of the September 7 meeting be approved. Motion passed. George asked about the audit. Rob responded that the auditor found we are doing better at our files than last year. He was very positive about our finances.

Treasurer - The September financial report was presented. Betty moved and George seconded that the financial report be accepted. Motion passed. It was pointed out that the \$295.30 under Miscellaneous was for the shirts. The income from those shirts was recorded along with the Giving Estimates. Jennifer also presented a first draft of the expense side of the budget for 2026.

Warden - Rob is waiting for the check from the diocese for the ad campaign. The grant committee has approved it, so it is a matter of just waiting for the check to arrive. He will then meet with the people at the paper to create the ad.

The Chamber of Commerce has not created their welcome packets yet. They hope to have them ready by the end of the year.

Marion Medical Missions has already received a check from Lisa's brother in honor of their wedding anniversary. That will be included in our amount for a grant request from the diocese. We have also received donations of \$400 from the congregation. After November 2, we will total the amount and apply for the matching grant.

Priest - While the diocesan budget for 2026 is still a work in progress, the revenue side is complete. Our assessment for 2026 will be \$4399, which is a decrease of \$271 from 2025.

The theme of the Stewardship Campaign this year is "Tell Out My Soul". We will announce that we would like the cards returned by November 30.

Since Diocesan Council will be meeting in Excelsior Springs Saturday, I will be going to the archives on Friday and staying overnight. I will be back Saturday evening.
