Here we are already into February and what do I write about this month. A couple of months ago, I looked at a person who was mentioned on the first page in Forward Day by Day. So, in February, the first name I came across was that of Anskar.

Anskar was born near Amiens, France in 801 and became a Benedictine monk. Having visions which seemed to call him to missionary work, he dedicated himself to living a holy life. The king of Denmark, King Herold, had been exiled by his people. While exiled, he converted to Christianity and was baptized. His plan was to go home and asked Anskar to go with him and so he began his missionary work in Scandinavia.

His task was not easy and he saw many setbacks in his lifetime. Bishop Ebbo of Rheims had already tried to convert the north of Europe and failed. Part of the problem was that the Vikings prided themselves on oath-breaking and revenge. Imagine trying to convince them that truth and forgiveness were virtues! Anskar's approach was to establish a school at Schleswig with the help of another monk, Autbert. This proved successful. However, King Harold, however, did not know how to manage people. He pushed them so hard to become Christians that they threw him out of the country again. Anskar and Autbert had to leave, too.

But King Bjorn of Sweden had heard of the success of Anskar's school. He invited the monk to Sweden and, in the company of a French embassy, Anskar headed north. The embassy was attacked and robbed and even Anskar's religious books were taken, but although his companions wanted to turn back, he would not. He pressed on to Sweden where he converted Herigar, the chief royal counselor, who then built Sweden's first church in 832. A year and a half later, Anskar left Sweden as the pope had appointed him bishop (and later Archbishop) of Hamburg. Now, he was responsible to oversee most of Northern Europe, including Iceland and Greenland. He was given an abbey in Flanders where he opened a school.

Charles the Bald, King of the Franks, took away Anskar's abbey school. But the gallant evangelist would not give up. He went to Jutland, won Eric's friendship, convinced the king to treat slaves more kindly and got permission to start a church. That's when he introduced the bells. Are bells magical? When Bishop Anskar introduced them in Denmark, the pagans resisted their use, probably thinking that their gods would be angered or frightened by their pealing. But, Anskar wouldn't give up.

The archbishop died on February 3, 865. He spent the night before in prayer for his mission. On the morning of his death, "he lifted up his hand and prayed that God in His goodness would forgive whoever had done him any wrong. Then he began to say over and over again the verses: 'According to Thy mercy think thou upon me, according to Thy goodness, O Lord,' [Ps 25:6] and 'God be merciful to me a sinner,' (Luke 18:18) and 'Into Thy hands, O Lord, I commend my spirit.'" (Luke 23:46) When he could not speak for lack of breath, he ordered one of the brethren to continue saying the same words for him. "And so, with his eyes fixed on heaven, he breathed forth his spirit which had been commended to the grace of the Lord."

Unfortunately, his death brought the worst setback of all. The faith he had labored so hard to spread had evidently not been firmly grounded; Christianity virtually disappeared from Scandinavia. Those who came after him had to rebuild almost from scratch.

I hope you found this as interesting as I did.

Minutes

Present: Fr. Chandler Jackson, Rob Barns, George Keller, Jennifer Marbut, Betty Gloyd.

Fr. Jackson opened the meeting at 10:56 with a prayer and historical ideas about St. Nicholas.

Reports

Secretary - George moved and Rob seconded that the minutes of the November meeting be approved. Motion passed.

Treasurer - The November financial report was presented. Rob moved and Betty seconded that the financial report be accepted. Motion passed.

Warden - Rob reported that we need to change companies for the snow plowing. Our previous company is no longer doing that service. It was suggested that he find out who plows the vet clinic next door. As a result, he met with Mike Ryan, who quoted a price of \$150 to plow the upper parking lot. Since this is lower than what we paid last year, Rob moved that we accept the offer from Mike Ryan. Betty seconded the motion. Motion passed. Rob will contact Mr. Ryan whenever we need the lot plowed, which was agreeable to Mr. Ryan.

Priest – Yesterday, Rev. Benjamin George-Thoms was installed as rector at St. John's, Springfield. There was a very good turnout for the service. Rev Canon Chas Marks is officially the new Canon for Common Mission. He will begin his new role the first of the year. One of his first tasks will be to help St. Augustine's find a new rector as he will be resigning from that position.

I will be taking the last week of the year as my final week of vacation. The service on December 28 will be Morning Prayer with a carol sing in place of the sermon.

New Business: It is necessary each year to pass a resolution regarding clergy designating a portion of their salary as housing allowance. George moved and Rod seconded the following resolution.

Resolution of the Bishop's Committee of St. Matthew's Episcopal Church, Ozark, MO  
to Designate a Portion of Clergy Salary for IRS Parsonage Exclusion

WHEREAS, St. Matthew's employs certain clergy ("Clergy") to provide ministerial services; and  
WHEREAS, St. Matthew's does not provide housing to the Clergy; and  
WHEREAS, Section 107 of the Internal Revenue Code permits members of the clergy to exclude from gross income (in computing federal income taxes) a designated allowance paid to the clergyperson as part of their compensation (the "Parsonage Exclusion") to the extent such funds are used by the clergyperson for actual expenses in owning or renting a home (including furnishings, utilities, and maintenance); and

WHEREAS, the Parsonage Exclusion must be authorized by the governing body of the clergyperson's employer; therefore

BE IT RESOLVED, that St. Matthew's, as the employer of the Clergy, through the Bishop's Committee, its Board of Directors, hereby authorizes the Parsonage Exclusions for the Clergy listed below for the calendar year 2026:

The. Rev. Chandler C. Jackson ..... \$7,800.00

Motion passed.

It has been suggested that we move the Annual Meeting from the third Sunday in January to the first Sunday in February. Since we normally have a potluck with the Annual Meeting and also on the first Sunday of each month, this will lighten the load for our cooks.
